SPARTANBURG MAN RECEIVES 20-YEAR PRISON SENTENCE FOR CHILD SEX ASSAULTS

A Spartanburg man received a 20-year prison sentence today after he admitted to inappropriate sexual activity with three children.

Floyd Cartee, 40, pleaded guilty to first-degree criminal sexual conduct, second-degree criminal sexual conduct and assault and battery of a high and aggravated nature. He will serve 85 percent of Circuit Judge Derham Cole's prison sentence before he is eligible for release. He will also have his name added to the Sex Offender Registry.

The assaults occurred over a 17-year period at multiple locations in Spartanburg County. The mother of one of the victims filed a complaint with the Sheriff's Office on Oct. 16, 2007.

Cartee denied the allegations when he was first questioned by deputies and he volunteered to take a Polygraph test. Cartee confessed to the crimes after he failed the Polygraph test. Deputies furthered their investigation with support from the Children's Advocacy Center.
